The film also explores the negative impacts of continued reliance on “dirty coal” produced electricity.

“Keeping the Lights On” has inspired people to become active in searching for better alternatives for electric generation. A recent showing at the Wisconsin Film Festival in Madison brought rave reviews.

You are invited to take part in a facilitated discussion immediately following the film. Local residents that have taken a stance against these proposed landfill sites will share their stories and answer audience questions. Representatives from “Clean Wisconsin” will address regional, state, and legislative activities around this important issue.
